With reference to your letter of the 13th May, I find that the Coventry Gauge and Tool Co., the contractors for the Hell printers, having ordered motors from Klaxons Ltd. to be supplied to the design and circuit specified by the Post Office, asked Klaxons to make certain modifications to the first motor supplied for the prototype printer as it did not conform to the required standards of wiring.

I am sorry that in the first place our approval of the modifications to the motor was deferred pending approval of the prototype printer as a whole, but this has since been given and there is no longer any reason for deliveries of motors to be held up on this account.
